SPORT AT KAIAPOI HIGH SCHOOL

Kaiapoi High School has an extensive range of sporting activities available for all students. Our School Sports Coordinators, Hayley Newton and Dot Dixon, can assist you with any inquiries. We can be contacted in the Sports Office (near the entrance to the student slide area) before school, during interval, in the lunch hour or after school.

Sport provides an excellent opportunity for you to mix with students from other year levels, build team spirit and make new friendships. Many of you will enjoy the challenge of improving your skills and participating at a high level. Others will appreciate the opportunity to be involved in social teams or to take part in recreational activities. There is a wide range of choice - so be active, have fun and enjoy your sport.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Expectations- Once involved in a team, you must make a commitment to participate in all practice sessions and games throughout the season. You have a responsibility to your coach, your teammates and to yourself to make a conscientious effort at all times. Kaiapoi High School is a fair-play school and we expect all players, coaches and supporters to abide by the fair-play charter, which is based on enjoyment, playing within the rules, respect for the referees, officials, opposition and supporters. Daily Notices- Information regarding team trials, house challenges, lunchtime activities, and upcoming events etc, is published in the daily notices, which can be found on the KHS app or on the website. A copy is also posted on the sports noticeboard.

House Challenges- Challenges are held each term with teams organised by your Deans & House Captains. Activities include basketball, volleyball, netball, softball, indoor soccer, fat mat splat, touch rugby, etc. If you wish to issue a challenge, simply contact your House Captain or Dean. Get your team together and go for it!

WEDNESDAY SPORT

Each term students participate in competition with other secondary schools in the Christchurch area on a Wednesday afternoon. You do not need to be an expert but know how to play. However, you do need to be enthusiastic, keen to learn and committed to playing each week. You can only play one sport on a Wednesday afternoon. House points will be awarded to all participants.

School Procedures

Absences: If your child is absent due to sickness, please telephone or email the office or leave a message via the school app at the start of the day to advise us. An email is sent if there is no explanation for an absence. The School is bound by Ministry of Education guidelines regarding approved reasons for absence from school. Lateness is NOT acceptable.

Uniform: Full uniform **MUST** be worn at all times by students. Items that do not align with the School's uniform policy will be held with the Senior Leaders (SLT) or Deans and students will need to collect the item from them, at an agreed time. Ongoing issues will result in parents/caregivers being contacted by SLT or Deans.

If a student is unable to wear any correct item of uniform for a day, they will need to produce an explanatory note from a parent/caregiver. A pass will then be issued by a member of the SLT or a temporary replacement of uniform provided.

Jewellery/Piercings/Hair: The only jewellery acceptable with the school uniform is a medic-alert bracelet, one fine neck chain or pendant of cultural significance, and small ear studs or sleepers. Other body piercings, including nose, tongue, chin or eyebrow stud, are not permitted for safety reasons. The School reserves the right to require modification of extreme hairstyles or unnatural hair colour. All boys, from Year 9 to Year 13, are required to be clean-shaven.

Cellphones and music devices are only to be used in class time as directed by staff. If these are not used as required, they may be confiscated until the end of the lesson or the end of the school day, as arranged with the student. If this is repeated, parents/caregivers will be contacted by a member of the SLT or Deans.

Appointments: If a student has an appointment that cannot be made outside school hours, a phone call should be made to our school absence line, an email sent or a message left via the school app. If a student is late for school after an appointment or for any other reason, they must first report to the office.

Leaving the School Grounds: Students are not permitted to leave the school grounds at any time, unless they have an appointment and have signed out at the office.

Spot Checks: The office staff will, at times throughout each term, conduct 'spot checks' of phone calls and notes received. Please do not be offended if you are phoned during a spot check.

BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE (BYOD) RECOMMENDED SPECIFICATIONS FOR 2024

As a school, we have not mandated a particular device for our students to use to support their learning. However, we have put together the following minimum specifications for a suitable device at Kaiapoi High School.

Screen size: 11 inch or greater

Processor: Dual Core (Quad Core recommended)

RAM: 4GB

Built-in wireless

Protective hard shell carry case

Battery life of at least 7 hours. We have limited charging stations, to be used during break times.

Antivirus software: Free is okay

Please note: Smart phones do not have the functionality required and are not part of the BYOD programme. The above specifications are for a laptop, which is what we are expecting students to use. If students currently have a tablet, eg. an iPad, then this is acceptable to use as a device, however students will need an external keyboard.

Brand names that should be able to meet our recommended specifications and be around a similar price are HP, Lenovo and Acer.

Please consider additional insurance, as a screen replacement can be approximately \$250.

Microsoft Office does not need to be purchased separately. The Office package will be able to be downloaded for free at the start of the year.

WHAT TO DO IF . . .

You feel sick or have been injured

- Go to the Health Clinic in Tawera Block. If this is unmanned, go to the student reception slide where one of the staff will ring home. There are no supplies of panadol or antihistamines at the office. If you require these regularly, the office can hold your own supply for you.
- Do not phone home on your cellphone or go home or to the sick bay unless you have first been to the student reception slide.

You cannot find the rest of your class

- The class could have gone to a different classroom or be in the library. There may be a room change that the office staff can tell you about. If you cannot find them *quickly*, go to the student reception slide.

You have lost something

- It is vital that you **name all your possessions clearly** - clothing, sports gear, calculators, etc.
- If you have lost something, ask at the student reception slide.
- **Money and other valuables should not be left in gym changing rooms or bags.** Hand them in to the student reception slide or P.E. teacher or sports coach for safekeeping.

You have a non-uniform item at school

- If for any reason you are wearing a non-uniform item at school you must see a SLT member **first thing in the morning** (before 9am) for a Uniform Exemption or an alternative item of clothing to wear.
- Bring a note with you from a parent/ caregiver explaining the reason.

You need to ring home

- The office will allow you to make urgent-only phone calls on the office phone.

You have a question or problem concerning school buses

- Email bus.controller@kaiapoi.school.nz

You or your parents need to contact the school

- Ring 375.5004 during school hours. Explain to the office staff member what you want and they will take it from there.

You are worried about a personal difficulty

- Talk to a Guidance Counsellor or Health Nurse.
 - To see a Guidance Counsellor or Health Nurse, you need to make an appointment online, via the Student Wellbeing booking system on the KHS website.
- You should not use class time to make appointments.

You have a medical or dental appointment during school hours

- Appointments should be made outside school hours if possible. If an appointment must be made in school time, bring your appointment card to school and before you leave report to the office where you will show the card to a staff member and sign out. You also need to sign back in when you return.

You want to play a sport

- See the Sports Coordinator, Mrs Newton, in the sports office.

You need to see a teacher

- Try the classroom that you are taught in by that teacher first. Next, try the staff workroom connected to the block where that classroom is. As a last resort, go to the staffroom and knock on the door. Ask the staff member who comes to the door if the teacher is in the staff room and if they will see you.

You want to learn a musical instrument

- See Mr Mead, who is in charge of Music in the school.

You are being bullied or harassed

- See your Class Teacher, Tutor Teacher, Dean, Guidance Counsellor, or Mrs Enersen.

You see someone causing damage or bullying, stealing or breaking school rules

- You should report this to a staff member as soon as you can.

You accidentally cause damage

- You should report this to a staff member as soon as you can.

You feel you have been unfairly treated by a teacher

- Try politely to discuss it with the teacher (good manners always impress and will help you). If this seems impossible, see your Dean.

You are absent from school

- If you know that you will be away (e.g. funeral, appointment, etc.), your parent/caregiver should phone the school absence line, email the school office or send a message via the school app. The app can be downloaded from the school website, under General Information.

- If you are away through illness, your parent/caregiver should ring the absence line, email the school office or send a message via the school app early in the school day. You are expected to catch up on work missed.

- If your family wishes you to take time off school for family reasons (e.g. trip overseas), your parent/caregiver must discuss the matter with Mr Reid before the departure date.

You feel you are not coping with a subject or are worried about your subject choice

- See Mrs Young.

You lose your timetable

- Go online to the student portal on the home page of the student site of the KHS website.

You hear a rising siren followed by a voice telling you to evacuate the building

- This is the emergency signal. Go to the assembly area at the tennis courts, keeping clear of buildings.
- Line up quietly and wait for further instructions.

You bring your bike, scooter or skateboard to school

- Bike stands are provided for bikes and scooters. Students need to provide their own locks for these.
- Skateboards are stored in a box near the student slide during school hours and students will not be able to access these until after school.

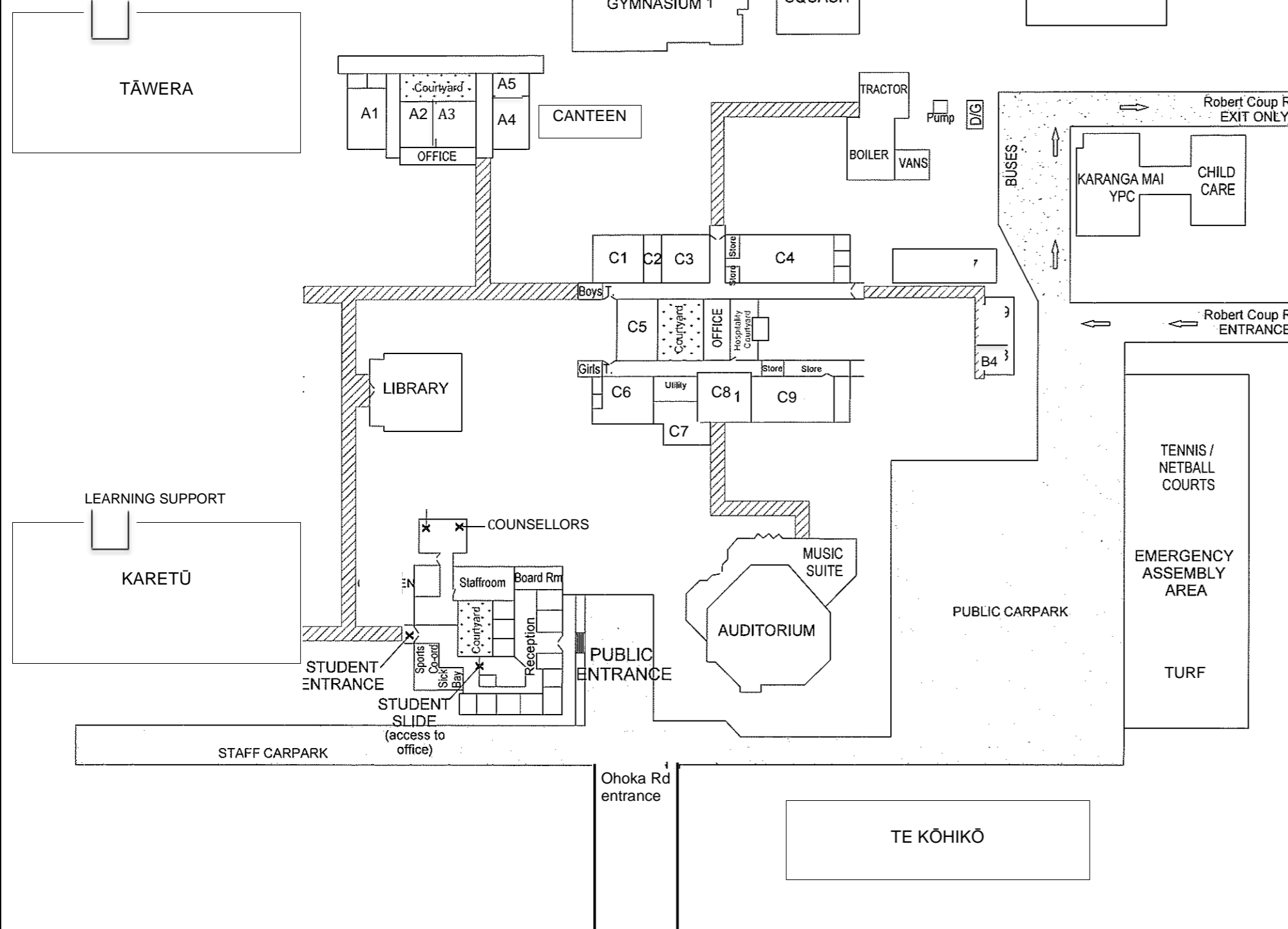
